


Embroidered Line Art Activity Kit



Materials Included:


- Sample silhouettes and a template to draw your own silhouette
- 8x10 stretched canvas
- Paint brush
- Paint (black and white)
- Painter's tape
- Needle on scrap felt
- Embroidery thread (black and white)

Objective(s):


Use the craft supplies provided to learn and practice basic hand sewing, combined with paint to make a unique painting

Provide Your Own:

- Scissors
- Cup for water
- Table cover or newspaper to cover work surface
- (optional) gloves, apron,








Before you start

- Please take your time, and make your stitches carefully.
- Be patient with yourself.
- Be careful with the sewing needle. They can be sharp!

 Stitch to know: Practice on the felt scrap, if needed. Feel free to check YouTube videos for tutorials on this stitch.

Running stitch






Before you start

Sewing basics

Threading a needle:


- Use a little water to dampen one end of the thread, if needed, to make
 it easier to go through the eye of the needle (opening).
- Hold the dampened end of the thread in one hand between finger and thumb. Use the other hand to hold the needle.
- Put the whole dampened end of the thread carefully through the eye
 of the needle.
- Tie 2-3 simple knots on top of each other on the tail (other end of the thread).






Tying a knot:

- Tie a simple knot on the tail of the thread after threading a needle or to finish a project
- It may require 2-3 knots over the same spot to make a bigger knot









Step 1: Getting started:

- Choose your silhouette image. You can either use the provided images or draw/print your own within a 7.5x5.5" rectangular space. Keep images simple but distinct enough to tell what it is.
- Think of how you want to divide your canvas in black and white sections. You might divide in diagonal halves, thirds, quarters, either symmetrical or asymmetrical.
- Use the tape to divide into sections




Step 2: Paint in the white and black sections, including the edge of the canvas.

- Dampen flat brush (not dripping wet)
- Start with one paint color and fill in the section(s) with that color
- Put the brush in the water cup and clean off paint. Pat it dry with a paper towel, so it is not dripping wet
- Use the other paint color for the other section(s).
- Let dry.
- Repeat above to paint a second layer of both paints.



Step 3: Once the paint dries, carefully remove the tape. The canvas that had tape on it has to be painted.

- Get a new strip of tape, and carefully place it just inside the edge of the painted section, so it does not get painted on.
- · Repeat step 2 for painting.
- · Once the paint dries, carefully remove the tape





Step 4: Once the paint is dry, position the image over the canvas, and place tape in the corners to hold it in place.

- Keep the image within a 7.5x5.5" space if you draw or print a silhouette.
- You do not need to cut the shape out, just the rectangle around the shape.

Avoid placing the image over the wooden frame (it is harder to

sew over the frame)



Step 5: Use the sewing needle to poke holes through the canvas, outlining the whole design with holes about 1/4" to 1/2" apart. (1 pinky tip's width) Carefully remove the paper of the image (keep nearby for reference, as needed).



Step 6: Embroider the image using the running stitch. Use white thread on the black part of the canvas and black thread on the white part of the canvas.

- Thread the needle with appropriate color thread and tie a new knot. Keep the knot on the back of the canvas. Use a running stitch to sew around the border of the silhouette. Keep stitches even and neat.
- Re-thread and re-knot as necessary.
- · Tie a knot when you finish. Trim excess thread.
